## WHO IS IT FOR?

General, specialist paediatricians and pediatric residents who care for children with life threatening and/or life limiting conditions.

## What are the requirements?

The Basic Course (starting 13th November ) will cover 12 topics. There will be weekly sessions on Saturdays ( 3 pm to 4.30 pm ). The course requirements are: $80 \%$ attendance and $70 \%$ correctly filled out post test questions. Those who complete the requirements will be awarded a certificate from the IAP.

## WHAT WILL YOU LEARN?

This course will be conducted by renowned specialists in palliative care helping participants with practical tips on :

- How to identify children who need Pediatric Palliative Care (PPC) in these life limiting conditions
- Management of pain and prevention of procedural pain
- Role of palliative care in managing Gl symptoms and Respiratory and Cardiac symptoms
- How to approach a child with Neurological symptoms - Demonstrating how children can be included in information sharing and decision making with regard to their care
- Managing ethical challenges in PPC
- Communicating with children based on their age/ development stage on death and the illness experience
- Caring for the adolescents requiring palliative and supportive care
- Caring for neonates requiring palliative care
- Caring for end of life paediatric patients
- Implemnenting palliative care in your setting
