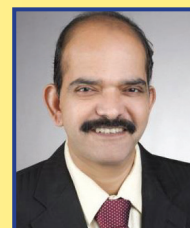

My Dear IAP Members,

Greetings from the office of IAP President.

Amidst the current ongoing pandemic of COVID 18 when we all are suppose to maintain physical distance (social distancing) and travel restrictions it is nice to get connected with all IAP colleagues through the Academy Today e- bulletin.

Friends, in the first few months of 2020 when countries like China, Italy, USA, Iran were reporting cases of COVID 19 it was never predicted that COVID 19 will be such a big public health problem with high morbidity and unpredictable mortality for our country too. The proactive approach of union government of sudden introduction of nationwide lockdown in very early stage of pandemic probably helped in slowing down pace of the spread of the disease in our country and getting our infrastructure get upgraded. But abrupt and prolonged lockdown affected the routine maternal and child care, preventive services- vaccination and of course education of children. Due to closure of schools,

children are deprived of mid day meal which was substantially contributing to the daily nutritional requirements of school going children. Over and above that people facing economical crisis due to loss of pays aggravated the already existing problem of malnutrition. During the lockdown period the incidence of child abuse and mental health problems have gone up. To address all these co emerged problems of COVID 19 pandemic we IAPIans need to work proactively in collaboration with government and NGOs to address this issues because if not acted in time it will lead to several new epidemics: epidemics of vaccine preventable diseases, epidemic of malnutrition, epidemic of mental health problems. Indian academy of Paediatrics has rich network of 340 city/district branches and it is time for IAP to come forward voluntarily and contribute for the cause. Some vibrant branches of IAP e.g SPACT (Surat Paediatric Association Charitable Trust) and IAP Coal field branches are doing wonderful work in addressing issues of Immunization and nutrition respectively in their region.

The health care professionals are the front line warriors in the fight against COVID 19 and naturally that put them at risk of acquiring the infection. We have many reported incidences of infection amongst the health care workers and we lost few of them due to COVID 19. Friends we can not afford this casualties and for that we need to be cautious and take up most care by using appropriate PPE, hand hygiene and some appropriate changes in our working style. Periodically ICMR, MoHFW and our own IAP is coming out with the guidelines and we need to keep over selves updated with it and put it in practice.

The pandemic has put so many restrictions on all- individual as well organizations activities. But innovative initiative by central IAP (dIAP) under leadership of president Dr. Bakul Jayant Parekh, Honorary secretary general Dr. G V Basavaraja and scientific chair Dr. Mahesh Mohite has maintained the momentum of academics. The 57th National Conference of Indian Academy of Pediatrics (PEDICON 2020) was held from January 9-12, 2020 at Brilliant Convention Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh, India. Nominations for FIAP - 2021, on **prescribed form** are invited. The FIAP Nomination form could be obtained from the Central IAP Office on request. The nomination for FIAP should be submitted in 6 (SIX) copies. The nominations will be accepted from January 1, 2021 to March 31, 2021. The last date for submission of nomination for 2021 to the Central IAP Office is 31st March 2021.

Rules:

- The nomination should be submitted in the prescribed form duly proposed and seconded by the eligible Fellows and/or Life Members of the IAP to be submitted in 6 (SIX) copies.
- Any Fellow/Life member of Society, who has, in the opinion of the Executive Board, rendered outstanding services for the furtherance of the objectives of Society, may be elected as a Fellow Members by the Executive Board in the manner hereinafter provided. Maximum such fellowship granted in a year will be one/ per thousand members of having voting rights subject to a qualifying mark of 70 per cent as per the criteria decided by the Executive Board.
- The nominee should have been a member of the Indian Academy of Pediatrics for 10 years before submission of his/her nomination to the Indian Academy of Pediatrics. The enrollment year of the membership of the nominee shall be taken as full year of membership for the purpose of computing 10 years of membership.
- A duly signed consent of the nominee stating that he/she is willing to be nominated to Fellowship of the Indian Academy of Pediatrics should be given.
- The eligible Fellow and/or Life member of the IAP is entitle to nominate only one nominee for FIAP in a year.
- The proposer and the seconder of the nomination should have been the member of the Indian Academy of Pediatrics for 10 years before proposing / seconding the name of any member for the FIAP.
- The membership strength of voting members shall be taken as of 31st March 2021.
- Any person who is either an Associate Life member of the society and who has in the opinion of the Executive Board rendered outstanding services for the furtherance of the objectives of the Society, may be elected as Fellow Member of the Society by the Executive Board of the Society in a manner hereinafter provided subject to a limit of two per year (over and above the fellowship awarded to Life Member). However, such fellows shall not have voting rights.

- Honorary Fellowship can be bestowed to any other person, who has rendered his selfless yeomen services to the cause of child health, after approval of the Executive Board of the Society, subject to maximum two per year. Such honorary fellows will not enjoy life members' privileges including voting right and their name shall not be entered into membership registry. However, the President and the Secretary if given Honorary Fellowship will continue to be on the member of the membership registry.
- The nominations for fellowship shall be duly proposed and seconded by Fellow and/or Life member of the Society in appropriate format with recommendation for such a proposal, and the proposal and recommendation shall be submitted to the members of the Fellowship Committee constituted by the Executive Board. This five member committee shall consist of the President, President Elect, the immediate two preceding Past Presidents and the Vice President (Senior most by age) of Indian Academy of Pediatrics. The names recommended by such a committee will then be approved by the Executive Board.
- The evaluation of FIAP nominations will be done by the designated committee members.
- The nominations will be invited through an announcement in IAP's publications or in any other form like circular. 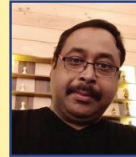
