President's Address

Dear All,

In this February issue of Child India we are discussing about treatment of inborn errors of metabolism (IEMs) which may present at any age (antenatal, birth, infancy, childhood or adulthood), with symptoms that range from abrupt in onset and episodic to chronic and progressive. Poor feeding, vomiting, failure to thrive, lethargy, delay or regression of milestones, acidotic breathing, hyperammonemia, hypoglycemia, seizures, ataxia, seizures, coma, fulminant hepatoencephalopathy and/or decompensation out of proportion to what would be expected from intercurrent infection should ring alarm bells.



IEMs are rare genetic (inherited) disorders in which the body cannot properly turn food into energy. They are categorized as disorders of carbohydrate metabolism, amino acid metabolism, organic acid metabolism, or lysosomal storage diseases. Over 1000 inherited disorders caused by mutations in genes coding for proteins that function in metabolism have been identified. Most of the disorders are inherited as autosomal recessive, whereas autosomal dominant and X-linked disorders are also present. Few of the IEMs are

Phenylketonuria (PKU)

Galactosemia (GAL)

Maple Syrup Urine Disease (MSUD)

Fructose intolerance

The estimated incidence of IEM is 50/100,000. This translates to nearly 10-12000 infants and children in our country who need specialized nutrition and medical attention. Our country also has a high prevalence of consanguineous marriages which gives an indication to the possibility of high occurrence of IEM.

Early diagnosis of these metabolic disorders will certainly help in preventing the irreversible complications and significantly improve the long-term prognosis, by early treatment. Knowledge, information and availability of specialized products for the treatment of many metabolic disorders which can present with nutritional emergencies is essential, for the affected child to survive and thrive. Awareness and implementation about Neonatal screening tests coupled with prompt institution of the specific treatment will go a long way in management of many metabolic disorders.

Metabolic Disorders

Inherited Metabolic Disorders -Basic principles of treatment

- 1. Prevent catabolism Administration of calories used in acute episodes to slow down catabolism. A poor intake of calories can contribute to poor metabolic control just as much as an excessive intake of the offending substance.
- 2. Restrict the intake of the offending substance if possible, through manipulation of the diet.
- 3. Increase excretion of toxic metabolites by using alternative pathways. For example, carnitine is useful in the elimination of organic acids in the form of carnitine esters. Sodium benzoate and phenylacetate are useful in treating hyperammonemia.
- 4. Increase the residual enzyme activity (if possible) administration of pharmacological doses of the vitamin cofactor for the defective enzyme. If the binding constant for the vitamin has been altered and the enzyme is otherwise reasonably functional, increasing the vitamin concentration will increase enzyme activity via a mass action effect.
- 5. Specific Management: Dietary therapy, Enzyme replacement Therapy, Transplantation, gene therapy may cure many IMD, but irreversible brain damage may have occurred before there is an opportunity to use these therapies.

Management Guidelines depends on presentation

A) Inherited metabolic disorders - Acute Intoxication

Prototype disorders

- 1. Restrict protein: Restrict protein intake totally until the crisis is over, but usually no longer than 48 hours. Slowly reintroduce at 0.25 to 0.5 gm/kg and gradually increase to prevent catabolism of endogenous protein
- 2. Special amino acid mixture if available-as for MSUD, Propionic acidemia
- 3. Ensure adequate caloric intake with intake of high carbohydrate: diet or IVF-hyperosmolar glucose through central venous line; add intravenous lipids if necessary

Glucose 15-20g/kg/day

Add fat 2g/kg/day

Always add Insulin starting with 0.05unit/ $\ensuremath{\mbox{kg/hr}}$

 $Useful \, combination \, is \, 1 \, unit \, of \, Insulin/8 gms \\ of \, glucose$

Adjustments are made depending on blood glucose

- 4. Detoxifying medications:
- a. Urea Cycle Disorders Benzoate, phenylacetate, arginine, citrulline as needed. [See in treatment of hyperammonemia]
 - b. Organic acidemia Carnitine
 - 5. Targeted cofactor therapy

- a. Propionic acidemia Consider Trial of Biotin in all cases
 - b. Methymalonic acidemia Vitamin B 12
- c. Glutaric acidemia Riboflavin in high doses [200-300mg/day]
- 6. Treatment for any triggering infection should be started as appropriate.
- 7. Because of potentially severe metabolic stress caused by fever, temperatures in excess of 37.80 C should be treated aggressively with acetaminophen, and if necessary, ibuprofen. Use a cooling blanket if necessary
- 8. Avoid constipation in Urea cycle disorders and organic acidemia Use Lactulose to ensure 2-3 stools per day. May give bowel wash early before Lactulose starts acting.
- 9. Oral antibiotics Metronidazole for gut sterilization in urea cycle defects and organic acidemias

B) Inherited metabolic disorders - Acute acidosis

- 1. Adequate hydration.
- 2. Fluid bolus-IVF containing 75-150 mEq of isotonic NaHCO3 [75 for massive ketosis; 150, if in coma or HCO3 is less than 10 mEq/L]
- 3. Forced diuresis with large amounts of fluids and frusemide is successful in methylmalonic aciduria for removing methylmalonate from the body
- 4. Check acid base, electrolyte status every 6 hours
 - 5. For organic acidemia Carnitine therapy-
- a. Oral less well tolerated give up to $100 \, \text{mg/kg/d}$
 - b. IV infusion daily 100 mg/kg/d
- 6. For Isovaleric acidemia Glycine 500 mg/kg Promotes excretion of isovaleryl glycine

C) Inherited metabolic disorders -Hyperammonemia

Prototype: Urea cycle disorders & Organic acidemias

- 1. Restrict protein intake and supplement enough glucose and calories
- 2. Na Benzoate: Loading dose 250 mg/kg over 1-2 hrs.

Daily dose [IV infusion] 250-500 mg/kg

3. Na phenylacetate: 250 mg/kg over 1-2 hrs.

Daily dose [IV infusion] 250-600 mg/kg

4. Na phenylbutyrate: 250 mg/kg over 1-2 hrs.

Daily dose [IV infusion] 250-600 mg/kg

5. L-Arginine: [In Urea cycle disorders only].

In ornithine transcarbamylase (OTC) deficiency/ carbamoyl phosphate synthetase (CPS) Type 1 deficiency - 250 mg/kg over 2 hrs. Daily dose [IV infusion] 200-250 mg/kg.

In citrullinuria & ASA deficiency - 600 mg/kg over 2 hrs. Daily dose [IV infusion] 600 mg/kg.

Arginine is contraindicated in Arginase deficiency

- 6. Carnitine 50-100 mg/kg loading and daily infusion
- 7. Ammonia levels > 600 micromol/L [1000 microgm/dl] Hemodialysis > Peritoneal dialysis > Arteriovenous hemofiltration > exchange transfusion
- 8. Monitor for hypernatremia when using sodium benzoate and other sodium compounds

D) Inherited metabolic disorder - Reduced fasting tolerance

Prototype disorders: Medium chain acyl CoA dehydrogenase/ Long chain acyl CoA dehydrogenase deficiency



- 1) IV therapy with balanced glucose and electrolyte solution should be started promptly at one and a half to twice maintenance for correction of hypoglycemia and acidosis.
- a. Blood glucose concentration should be kept above 80 mg/dl. Use a 10% dextrose IV solution 10-12 gm/kg/minute or more Glucose [10 g/kg/d = 7-10 mg/kg/min]
- b. IV infiltrations or other IV interruptions must be remedied promptly. Even one hour without IV dextrose may result in neurologic sequelae. If patient is able to take orally 10-15% glucose polymer may be used orally or NG tube
- c. Metabolic acidosis may require treatment with boluses of sodium bicarbonate at 1 2 mEq/kg IV.
- 2) The need to supply caloric requirements must take precedence over fluid balance. Diuretics should be used, as long as the child is not anuric, in lieu of reducing the IV rate if fluid overload is a concern. The IV rate should not be lowered because of mild to moderate hyperglycemia.

Elevations of blood glucose may occur as a physiological response to relative intracellular hypoglycemia, a common phenomenon in metabolic diseases.

If there is a need to control hyperglycemia, insulin at 0.02 to 0.05 units/kg/hr should be started and adjusted to maintain blood glucose between 100 and 150 mg/dl.

- 3) Do not administer IV lipids. Intralipid is contraindicated.
- 4) Labs should be sent for glucose, electrolytes, blood ammonia, CBC, BUN, creatinine, uric acid, LFTs, CPK, blood gas for pH, and urine for myoglobin. Heparinised plasma for carnitine (1 ml) and urine organic acids (15 20cc) should be collected, frozen, and sent STAT on dry ice to a laboratory.
- 5) A chest x-ray and Doppler echocardiography should be considered since

 $cardiomy opathy \, is \, associated \, with \, this \, condition. \,$

- 6) Treatment for any triggering infection should be started as appropriate.
- 7) Because of potentially severe metabolic stress caused by fever, temperatures in excess of 37.80 C should be treated aggressively with acetaminophen, and if necessary, ibuprofen. Use a cooling blanket if necessary.
- 8) Carnitine should be supplemented at the usual dose orally if tolerated at $100 300 \, \text{mg/kg/day}$
- 9) When enteral feeds are started, they should be ordered every 3 4 hours. Diet limits the use of long chain fats to 15- 20% of total calories and recommends that MCT comprise 15- 20% of the calories. Daily calorie counts should be conducted to closely monitor the intake
- In Long-Chain 3-Hydroxyacyl-CoA Dehydrogenase (LCHAD) Deficiency, oral DHA supplementation has been tried with some
- 10) Patient should be continued on hydration therapy (1 1/2 times maintenance) until the CPK level begins to decrease significantly, creatinine normalizes, and gross myoglobinuria has resolved. Patient should also be clinically improved without significant myalgia.

E) Inherited metabolic disorders - Disturbed Energy Metabolism

Prototype disorders: Defects in Pyruvate dehydrogenase complex (PDHC), the Kreb's cycle and respiratory electron transport chain defects

Acute crisis can manifest as life threatening metabolic acidosis, ketoacidosis and lactic acidemia

- 1. Vigorous treatment of acid base balance
- 2. Patients with PDHC deficiency are glucose sensitive; glucose infusion not more than 2-3 mg/kg/min
 - 3. Patients with Electron transport chain

(ETC) defects, glucose 10-15 mg/kg/min

- 4. Very high lactate levels may be lowered by dialysis or, by administration of Dichloroacetate: 15 200 mg/ kg/day oral or intravenous
- 5. In patients with mitochondrial disease, cofactor replacement has been tried with varied success. Anecdotal reports of success with various cofactors have been reported. A single form of therapy cannot be recommended in all cases. A trial of the following drugs is worth considering
- a. Biotin-in multiple carboxylase deficiency-proven role in most cases

c. Co enzyme Q 10: Dose: $4.3\ mg/kg/\ day$; range: $30\text{-}300\ mg/day}$. Can be dissolved in vegetable oil and then added to food

d. Vitamin E

- e. B Complex vitamins Thiamine [300 mg/d], niacin, pyridoxine, vitamin C [5 mg/kg/d], folic acid, B 12, Pantothenic acid
- f. If a measured deficiency of carnitine is found, L-carnitine supplementation to be given
- 6. Other supportive measures to reduce cerebral edema such as Mannitol may also be given
- 7. Actively search for precipitants of crisis such as infection and actively treat them.

REPORT OF 30TH INTERNATIONAL PEDIATRIC ASSOCIATION (IPA) CONGRESS AND 60TH INDIAN ACADEMY OF PEDIATRICS PEDICON 2023

The 30th International Pediatric Association (IPA) Congress and 60th Annual Conference of the Indian Academy of Pediatrics (IAP) was held from February 19th to 23rd, 2023, at the Mahatma Mandir Convention and Exhibition Centre in Gandhinagar, Gujarat, India. This event brought together pediatricians, researchers, and healthcare professionals worldwide to discuss the latest advancements in pediatric care, research, and education.

The conference was attended by more than 6,500 delegates, including pediatricians, nurses, allied health professionals, researchers, and students, from over 100 different countries who participated in this mega event – 30th IPA congress organised in India after a span of almost 46 years to India.

The conference featured several keynote lectures, plenary sessions, symposiums, panel discussions, debates, oral paper presentations, poster presentations and pre-conference workshops covering a wide range of topics related to child health, including neonatology, infectious diseases, adolescent health, neurodevelopmental disorders, pediatric emergencies, etc. Along with the high-quality academic feast, there was a perfect blend of cultural and extracurricular activities. RACE 7 & Diamond Jubilee Pediatric League 2023.

Shri Bhupendra Patel, Hon. Chief Minister of Gujarat, inaugurated the conference, and Shri Mansukh Mandaviya, Hon. Health Minister, Government of India, gave a virtual address at the inauguration. The unique cultural event preceded the inauguration ceremony –UNITED COLOURS OF INDIA, where different dance forms representing different states of India were performed by our own pediatricians & IAP members like Bihu, Kathak, Ghummar, Kashmiri, Bhangra, Lavni & Garbas, ended by patriotic song Indiawale having all dignitaries on the stage with Indian flags in their hands.

The theme for the conference was "Quality Care for Every Child Everywhere." This theme emphasized the importance of providing high-quality healthcare services to every child, regardless of their geographic location or socio-economic background. The conference aimed to promote the adoption of evidence-based practices, the strengthening of health systems, and the development of policies that prioritize child health and development.

The conference was graced by the presence of over 800 distinguished guests and renowned speakers, Editors, as well as representatives from Govt. of India MOHFW and Govt Authorities from other countries, and senior health authorities, including Dr Joy Lawn, Professor, London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine, United Kingdom; Dr Ephrem Lemango, Associate Director Health, Chief of Immunization, UNICEF Headquarters, USA; Dr Esther Lau, Editor-in-Chief, The Lancet Child & Adolescent Health, United Kingdom; Dr Nick Brown, Editor-in-Chief, Archives Disease of Childhood, Sweden; Dr Sumita Ghosh, Commissioner Child Health, Government of India, and Shri Manoj Aggarwal, Additional Chief Secretary, Health & Family Welfare, Government of Gujarat. The speakers emphasized the need for collaborative efforts to address the global burden of childhood diseases and to promote child health and development.

The plenary sessions covered important topics for global child health and included Reaching Every Child, Meet the Editors, Growth Charts, Neonatal Survival, Technology in Child Healthcare, Immunization: Zero Dose Strategy, Redesigning School-Aged Child and Adolescent Health, and Effect



of Climate Change on Child Health. The speakers highlighted worldwide strategies and initiatives to improve child health, especially in low-income settings.

The conference also featured several workshops and hands-on training sessions on a variety of topics, including neonatal resuscitation, pediatric advanced life support, and pediatric ultrasound. These sessions provided practical training and skills development opportunities for healthcare professionals, especially those working in low-resource settings. Almost 700 scientific papers & poster entries came from PG students & residents as well as pediatricians. Out of which, 80 were selected for oral paper presentation & rest for E posters.

One of the highlights of the conference were the sessions on Vaccinology, which featured presentations by leading experts on the latest developments in vaccine research and development. The speakers discussed the challenges and opportunities in vaccine development, the role of vaccines in disease prevention and control, and the importance of vaccine hesitancy and vaccine equity.

The sessions on Pediatric Emergencies focused on the management of pediatric emergencies, including natural disasters, conflicts, and humanitarian crises. The speakers discussed the key principles of emergency preparedness and response, the challenges in delivering healthcare in resource-limited settings, and the importance of addressing the psychosocial needs of children and families affected by emergencies.

The Infectious Diseases sessions discussed the latest updates on a wide range of diseases that included HIV, Tuberculosis, Leprosy, Brucella, Leptospirosis, Covid19, Dengue, etc. The sessions also highlighted the rational use of antibiotics and ways to overcome antibiotic resistance.

The conference featured many innovations, such as promoting the "Go Green" mission. Not a single brochure was printed to promote the conference. All scientific literature and session details were made available on a mobile app designed especially for the conference. Even the delegate badges were prepared using eco-sensitive, non-tearable paper. The industry exhibition was well made, with over 70 exhibitors displaying their latest services and offerings. For the first time, an innovation hub was developed, having select companies and development partners displaying unique innovations in their areas of operations.

Various IAP Members were felicitated for life time achievement awards, FIAP & book release. Many state & city branches were given best branch awards in various categories. As a part of a charity activity from IPAPEDICON, we distributed freshly prepared food packets to 500 street children of nearby slums during all 5 days of the conference.

Delegates enjoyed entertainment evenings with a gala grand banquet dinner on the 21st & 22nd of February. Legendary singer Shankar Mahadevan performed with his son Siddharth on the 21st February evening & Indian idol fame & sensational yuva singers Pawandeep & Arunita Kanjilal made the evening memorable with melodious hindi songs & music on 22nf February in Hotel Leela lawns.

The conference demonstrated the commitment of the global pediatric community to advancing child health and development. It highlighted the need for continued efforts to address the challenges facing children and families worldwide. Overall, the conference provided an excellent platform for knowledge sharing, networking, and collaboration among pediatricians and healthcare professionals worldwide.


